In September 2004 we purchased our first two miniature horses, a six-month old colt and a yearling filly. Now three years later we have a total of 13 miniature horses, one miniature donkey, and a pony. The “herd” consists of adoptions, private sales, auction sales, and some were given to us to provide a good home. It is our privilege to have this family of horses and to share them with the community.

Working with miniature horses is simply a scaled down version of working with large horses—it’s just easier because of their small size. Don’t be fooled, however. Their small size does not diminish their personality and character. We have learned and enjoyed so much from our miniatures that we easily knew “what we wanted to do for the rest of our lives” to share our love of miniature horses “Cavallini di Amore” with children who might not otherwise have the opportunity or means to enjoy these beautiful little equines.

On May 1, 2007 we established Cavallini di Amore as a 501(c)(3) non-profit association. We operate entirely from donations and sponsorships to serve the public. Our service extends to foster care and social services, schools, hospitals, early learning and child care centers, support groups, and more.

Cavallini di Amore is located at our 10 acre “mini farm”, Brandy Manor, in Culpeper County, Virginia. Here children can learn, work and play with the miniatures. It is truly a unique experience that promotes kindness, respect, discipline, and positive self-esteem. From the simple tasks of grooming to more difficult levels of training, horse and child succeed together.
